

**MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT
BETWEEN
ROSS AND CAROL NESE COLLEGE OF NURSING
PENN STATE UNIVERSITY, SCRANTON CAMPUS
AND
JERSEY COLLEGE**

The Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) is hereby made and entered into by and between the Ross and Carol Nese College of Nursing, The Pennsylvania State University, Penn State Scranton campus, and Jersey College.

PURPOSE

The Ross and Carol Nese College of Nursing (Nese CON), The Pennsylvania State University Scranton campus (Penn State, SN), and Jersey College, Scranton Campus (Jersey College) establish this agreement to facilitate the admission of students who wish to obtain their Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN) through a 1+2+1-degree program. For year 1, - students will apply and if admitted to Penn State SN will take general education courses (Appendix A). During years 2 and 3, students will complete their associate degree in nursing (ADN) at Jersey College. During year 4, graduates of the Jersey College ADN program, who successfully maintained a GPA of 2.0 or higher, and successfully passed the National Council Licensure Examination (for) Registered Nurses (NCLEX-RN) will be re-enrolled by Penn State and admitted into the Registered Nurse to Bachelor of Science in nursing (RN to BSN) options of the BSN Program with advanced standing at Penn State SN as long as there is a cohort of 10-15 students. Provisional admission may be granted to Jersey College graduates who are scheduled to take the NCLEX-RN. Students may begin taking classes before passing the NCLEX-RN but must possess an active and valid RN license to enroll in required RN to BSN clinical courses to complete the program.

PROCEDURES

Counseling, admission, and the transfer of students under the terms of this agreement will be accomplished through the application of the following procedures and policies:

- Jersey College will promptly notify The Nese CON of any major curriculum modification, such as substantive curriculum revamping of the articulated program, and further agrees that the terms of this agreement will no longer apply to the program unless Penn State provides written approval that the curriculum changes do not alter the intent of this agreement.
- The Nese CON will likewise promptly notify Jersey College of any substantive curriculum revamping to the articulated program.
- Financial Aid will be processed at the student's school of enrollment.

Interested students will be admitted through the traditional enrollment process and enroll in Penn State Scranton as a first-year Nursing pre major (NRCOM) student. During their first year, students are required to take courses from a prescribed list. (See Appendix A).

At the end of their first semester, students will need to apply and be accepted into Jersey College's ADN program. Students may only apply if they have completed a minimum of 12 credits at Penn State SN. Students will need a GPA of 2.5 or greater from Penn State SN. Students accepted into the 1+2+1 program will have a reserved spot at Jersey College in the cohort following the completion of their 1st year at Penn State. Please see Appendix B for the current Jersey College Entrance Requirements.

Students must receive a 2.0 (C) or higher in English 15 and Math 21 to transfer those Penn State course credits into the Jersey College ADN program.

Upon completion of the Jersey College ADN program with a GPA of 2.0 (4.0 = A) and successfully passing the NCLEX-RN, the student may re-enroll into Penn State. Penn State may require a higher quality point average because of space availability or changes in the nursing program. Such requirements will be promptly communicated to the director of the Jersey College ADN program by the Nese CON. The change in grade point average will take effect with those students entering Jersey College in the fall semester after the institution has been notified.

Provisional admission may be granted to Jersey College ADN graduates who are scheduled to take the NCLEX-RN. Students may begin taking classes before passing the NCLEX but must possess an active and valid RN license to enroll in required RN to BSN clinical courses to complete the program.

A grade of "C" or better is required for all prescribed Penn State nursing courses.

The Nese CON recognizes the portfolio assessment policy established by Penn State. The Nese CON recognizes accredited AND by examination. RN to BSN students meeting established criteria may obtain up to 33 credits based on the Portfolio Assessment. To receive the portfolio credits, students must possess a current and valid RN license. A fee will be applied to the student's tuition bill and is payable at the time the portfolio credits are awarded.

All students must earn at least 36 of their last 60 credits at Penn State to receive a degree from Penn State.

Penn State will accept transfer credits based on the Jersey College courses evaluated for Penn State equivalency. Please see Appendix C for the list of courses and transfer credits accepted.

Students who reenroll at Penn State are able to complete their RN to BSN. Please see Appendix D for the list of the courses needed to complete a RN to BSN at Penn State.

Appendix E shows the full pathway for students to complete the 1+2+1 program.

GENERAL CONDITIONS


The Agreement will be reviewed every five years by Penn State SN, the Nese CON, and Jersey College. The agreement may not be amended, modified, supplemented, or terminated except by a written instrument signed by Nese CON, Penn State SN, and Jersey College.


The terms of this agreement shall remain in effect, except as stipulated in certain previous terms listed herein, until terminated by either party. Any party may terminate the agreement, with or without cause, on the provision of 120 days written notice to the other parties. In the event of termination by either party, each party's responsibilities for the education of students described in this Agreement shall continue until all cohorts of students who are officially enrolled at the time of the notice of termination have graduated from both the ADN and BSN phases of the program.

The Agreement represents the entire understanding between the parties, superseding any other prior or contemporaneous oral or written agreements. Any changes, corrections, or additions to this Agreement shall be in writing and signed by an authorized representative of each party.

APPENDIX B

Jersey College Entrance Requirements

To be accepted into the Jersey College (ADN) program students must:

- Complete two semesters totaling 24 credits at Penn State Scranton.
- Maintain a GPA of 2.5 or greater.
- Receive a combined score of 165 in reading and mathematics (with a minimum of 80 on the reading section) on the Jersey College Entrance Exam.

Jersey College will waive the entrance exam if you meet one of the criteria listed below:

- Have a GPA of 3.0 after the first 12 credits at Penn State.
- Have an SAT of 990 or higher. Or an ACT of 19 or higher.

Students must receive a 2.0 (C) or higher in English 15 and Math 21 to transfer those course credits into the Jersey College ADN program.

Jersey College will provide a scholarship of 10% of the tuition cost for those students entering the program with at least a 3.0 GPA.

Jersey College guarantees 5 positions each fall for qualified Penn State Scranton applicants. Additional students are encouraged to apply for admittance to this program.
